A high-level academic education with a strong research orientation providing profound insights into historical developments and systematic problems of modern and contemporary European philosophy.

The Master in Modern and Contemporary European Philosophy focuses on philosophy from Descartes to the present day and provides an in-depth study of European philosophy beginning with classical rationalism and empiricism, moving on to Kant and German idealism and concluding with 20th century and contemporary philosophy. Credited language courses give students the opportunity to improve their French and German language skills. Students may choose from a wide range of interdisciplinary course options covering the fields of history, politics literature and ethics. The programme also offers credited internship possibilities connecting students with the job market.

### Career perspectives

Successful completion of the programme will prepare for a career in cultural and political institutions, journalism and publishing. The degree also prepares for further studies at a PhD level.

### Programme structure

The curriculum covers a full-time two-year programme, with the final semester being dedicated to a semester-long thesis project.
